Chairperson's Report 2016

For the Pinawa Public Library, the most significant development during 2016 was the decision to merge the Pinawa Secondary School (PSS) and Public libraries. Early in 2016 the Superintendent of PSS initiated a discussion with the Pinawa Public Library Board with that aim in mind. The PSS library was staffed only part time, was underused and the collection needed updating. Since the two libraries were located in the combined High School and Community Centre, a merger was clearly possible in theory but challenging to put into practice. The Board and Library staff concluded that three fixes would be needed. One was to rearrange the circulation area, to reduce its footprint. The second was to conduct an aggressive weeding of the existing Public Library collection focusing mainly on Non-Fiction and Sci Fi. The third fix was an aggressive weeding of the High School collection. Once we understood the merger was workable, a Memorandum of Understanding was drawn up and signed by both parties. This included details of how the merger would occur, how the transition process would be managed, as well as the responsibilities of each party, including financial details. The aim was to provide library service from 9 A.M. to 4 P.M every school day except Monday every month of the year except July and August. This necessitated an increase in public library staff hours of 14 hours per week, paid for by the PSS. The transition was challenging but thanks to the efficiency of Public Library staff, it was smoother and quicker than had been anticipated. The newly merged library officially opened in January 2017.

During the year, eight special events were held, including a beer making demonstration, three book events, and for kids a Jamming in Your Jammies session with live music. Among other activities, the library was the venue for the Knit Shift get-togethers which included help sessions for knitters and crocheters.

We had a slightly smaller turnout for our sixth annual Quiz Night, but it was still a successful fund raiser for the library.
